It is sometimes difficult to look up a word in a dictionary if it starts with a silent letter. **Below are some words which have silent letters at the beginning.**

Silent 'k'	Silent 'w'	Silent 'g'	Silent 'p'
knee	write	gnat	psalm

knuckle	wrong	gnash	psychic
knock	wrap	gnarl	psychiatry

As you can see 'k' is often silent before 'n'

'w' is often silent before 'r'

'g' is often silent before 'n'

'p' is often silent before 's'
